Annual Report 2019

The San Diego-Riverside chapter continued to operate two restored lookout towers on Palomar Mountain in 2019. High Point Lookout (Register#735) is owned by the Cleveland National Forest, and Boucher Hill Lookout (Register #394) is owned by the California State Department of Parks and Recreation. The chapter deployed approximately 90 volunteer lookouts to staff each tower.

It was an unexpectedly quiet fire season in San Diego County for which we are thankful. Below are the stats for both towers for 2019.

***Individuals who visited immediate tower area. Over 900 of these (from 31 states and 7 foreign countries) elimbed the tower, signed the guest book and were provided area, Forest and fire safe information.
