Southeastern U.S. Chapter Report 2015

COVERAGE AREA: The Southeastern U.S. Chapter is made up of seven states which do not currently have their own individual chapters: Alabama, Georgia, Mississippi, Missouri, South Carolina, Texas and West Virginia.

MEMBERSHIP: The chapter currently has 27 paid members.

FINANCE: The chapter's individual account balance as of 12/31/15 was \$246.06.

FFLA AREA REPRESENTATIVES: The chapter continues to use 'Area Representatives' to promote FFLA activities within the member states. These Representatives are: Michael Finch (Georgia/South Carolina); M.T. Parker (Mississippi); Jim Lyon (Missouri); Ralph Harp (Texas) and Robert Beanblossom (West Virginia). Alabama remains vacant.

LOSSES: The states of Georgia, and to a smaller extent South Carolina, continued with the sale and removal of towers. The absence of FFLA chapters in these states continues to hinder our efforts to save and maintain these towers. Hopefully some of the new owners will discover the FFLA and become members of the organization.

GOALS FOR 2016: Continue to work towards the long range plan of establishing FFLA chapters in the individual states and eventually retire the Southeastern U.S. Chapter.
